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FOREWORD

I am delighted to be invited to welcome all participants - collectors, academics, curators, dealers, auctioneers - to this splendid 2nd edition of Asia Week Hong Kong. This year's programme is full of exciting events in this magnificent city, and I know that everyone will enjoy a memorable week.

It is a particular pleasure to celebrate Asia Week Hong Kong again, because it demonstrates that Hong Kong has successfully become the third global city where an Asia Week provides the formal structure for a wide variety of academic and commercial activities devoted to the Arts of Asia. I have watched on several occasions during my career how a nation's 'economic miracle', such as we have witnessed over the last decade in Greater China, has prompted a new enthusiasm among the nation's residents to collect artefacts from its own historic culture. How appropriate that Hong Kong can be the major vehicle to encourage this transfer of Chinese art essentially from the West back to its homeland in Greater China.

I am extremely proud that Bonhams is an established part of the vibrant art dealing and collecting community which stretches across Asia. Nowhere, however, is more exciting to us than this great city, where I have happily organised auctions in temporary venues for thirty years; and where because our Asia auction business, too, has rapidly matured - we shall in future do so in our new permanent Pacific Place Auction Gallery.

Special Guided Tour for Comix Home Base & Exhibition - "Starring under the Sky 2014 - In Memory of Hung Sin-nui"

Hung Sin-nui was a renowned contemporary Cantonese opera singer and movie actress. She created a unique crisp, smooth and flirtatious Hung-tone style of singing by incorporating Peking Opera and Kunqu Opera techniques, and Western opera singing methods.

She was regarded as a national treasure, the opera star and actress appeared in about 200 operas and more than 100 films. In 1985, she received the Outstanding Artist Award from the United Nations Asian Performing Arts Association and the Performing Arts Award from the United Nations Symphony Association. In 2001, she was named the Most Outstanding Artist of the Year at the Lincoln Center in New York. In 2009, she received an Honorary Academy Award from the China Theatre Association.

An exhibition - "Starring under the Sky 2014 - In Memory of Hung Sin-nui", will be held as a tribute to Hung. This guided tour is specially organised for Asia Week Hong Kong participants by the Hong Kong Arts Centre. Participants will also have a chance to tour around in the newly refurbished monument building of ten pre-war Grade 2 historic tenement houses Comix Home Base on Mallory Street/Burrows Street in Wan Chai.

YEWN's Imperial Amulet Collection Launching Preview

In the Manchu language, "Abkai Wehiyehe" means "Blessed by the Heaven" and was the name of Qing Dynasty Emperor Gaozong, whose reign was called Qianlong. Emperor Qianlong had become the greatest collector in Chinese history. Besides collecting, he is also the supervisor of court art production on different kinds of artworks.

LECTURE/TALK How to start a Collection - by Judith Rutherford

All collectors have one thing in common: they are passionate about their specific area of interest. No matter what the object of their interest, they will go to extraordinary lengths to track down and acquire a specific example.

One of the difficulties that collectors face in the long term is what to do with their collections. Families are often not interested in the collection of treasured possessions that one day they may inherit. Judith Rutherford will talk about her journey as a collector and the decisions she has made regarding her own private collection. She will also share some of the experiences that she has had advising and assisting other collectors.

Ms Judith Rutherford is an independent scholar in the field of Chinese textiles and the founder of the Textile Study Group of The Asian Arts Society of Australia (TAASA). She is the Immediate Past President of The Asian Arts Society of Australia and is now an Honorary Life Member.

Judith has lectured extensively in Australia, Hong Kong, Korea, and the USA. In 2011 Judith was invited by the Academy of Art in Hangzhou to lecture at a conference focusing on China's Tangible and Intangible Heritage "The History and Reality – International Conference on Cultural Heritage Preservation, Management, and Development".

Ju Ming - Sculpting the Living World Hong Kong Museum of Art

Ju Ming - Sculpting the Living World, the largest exhibition of works by the world-famous Chinese artist Ju Ming (朱鉊) ever held in Hong Kong, is running until June 15.

The internationally renowned sculptor Ju Ming has spent decades creating artworks. Ju has held many exhibitions in major cities in Asia, Europe and the United States, with his "Taichi Series" becoming his most famous set of works and winning him wide acclaim.

The "Living World Series" is one of Ju's most significant series of works, having taken more than 30 years to develop. These sculptures not only demonstrate the artist's exquisite craftsmanship, but also reflect his keen sense of observation and genuine emotion towards the vicissitudes of life.

The exhibition features 120 sets of works from the "Living World Series", made with materials including wood, ceramics, stone, bronze and stainless steel. The exhibition also features two of Ju's recent major breakthrough pieces, "Living World Series - Imprisonment" and "Cube". These two sets of creative works are beautifully crafted and question life from a philosophical point of view.

Symbolic Logic Identity Art Gallery

Expressionist lines, geometrical abstractions, surreal alterations and mythical figures are some of the visual clues presented in *Symbolic Logic*. The exhibition brings together 10 contemporary art practises from a cross-generational group of artists. *Symbolic Logic* demonstrates how paintings and their idiosyncratic set of symbols can polarise illusionary worlds.

George Boole in his study on Aristotelian logic aimed at creating a system of symbols and codes for translating the vagueness, equivocations and confusions deriving from ordinary language.

In a similar manner, works in *Symbolic Logic* retain an inherent and codified language. Instead of subsuming to the incoherency of their codes, these works allow their visual narrative to penetrate the contingent logic of its symbols. In an interplay between realistic signs and optical abstractions, the viewer is able to dissolve into the enigmatic power of the works.

Forces of Nature - Solo Exhibition of Chloe Ho 3812 Contemporary Art Projects

In a collection of ink and mixed media paintings, Chloe Ho (何鳳蓮) expresses the connection between life experiences and visual inference. She deals with forces of nature that fundamentally affect us all. The images are familiar, accessible - and yet, can be ambiguous and unique to the viewer's perception.

Certainly, our human collective experiences and our personal points of view influence what we see, how we respond and our relationship to the world around us. In her latest works, the artist purposely elicits responses of the viewers' own making.

She has created a veritable landscape of images inviting the viewer to step inside and to share the space as felt. They are clearly contemporary ink paintings, but grounded in the tradition of ink art. Chinese ink painting has long reflected the relationship of man and nature - and so the artist continues. The energy imparted brings nature to life, as she asks the viewer to tell their own story about the images, and imparts a sense of human natures seen and unseen.

Zhao Zhao (趙趙) has captured significant attention from the art world in recent years. His works vary from installation, to performance, painting and photography.

Eager to challenge reality and traditional ideology through a range of media, his radical and anarchist attitudes are a result of his focus on individual consciousness of freedom. Through the transformative power of materiality and communication, concepts of memories and histories are reenacted, challenged and reflected. Far from being a retrospective look at the past, Xu Bing shows how concepts and values of time are fundamental to our lives today.

Ink has been confined for generations to a masculine universe. Here, Hong Wai (洪慧) journeys with ink to a new frontier, that of the mysterious feminine. The mountain and river landscape has become instead a woman's body. The ode to heaven and earth has become an ode to the sensuous, the hidden, the ineluctable vin.

Shanghai-born artist Hong Wai uses her brush with uncommon skill, mastering the nuances of ink a well as the wash effect. Her works, using live with live models, exude an intimacy rare in Chinese painting. They are both highly feminine and feminist, examples of not just the beauty of the female form but also, somehow, their bold claim to independence in love and in spirit.

POETIC SPACE - Arthur Chan and Sim Chan YY9 Gallery

A joint exhibition by Arthur Chan (陳軒明) and Sim Chan (陳則), the two local artists present their latest series of artworks which provide a brand-new perception of poetic space via the transformation and deconstruction of architecture in the cityscape into creative works of interactive installation. Makoto Saito - Portraits Ticolat Tamura

The exhibition features a new body of work from the Portrait series of Japanese artist, Makoto Saito (齊藤誠), inspired from movies and the artist Lucian Freud. These paintings refer back to Saito's childhood memory of seeing foreign films with subtitles he could not follow, leading him to create his own story and imagined plot. Now, Saito extracts images and attempts to "witness how time difference is seen by expressing people of that time, using the current function of the mechanism". In this process, Saito strives to create the 'antithesis' with the use of computer and paint. Saito experiments with material and content, placing no constraints upon his creative process, and utilises computer software to superimpose multiple layers of imagery textured with oil and creates an effect of printed material.



Fabienne Verdier - Crossing Signs Le French May

Twenty years after her first exhibition in Hong Kong, Fabienne Verdier returns with a retrospective exhibition that traces her career from her initial, classical calligraphy right through to the major works that have seen her receive international acclaim.

A prize-winning graduate from Toulouse Art School, Verdier went to Sichuan in 1983 to be taught by the Grand Master Calligraphers, who were casualties of the Cultural Revolution. She has innovated, going so far as to bind the hair from 35 horse tails in one immense brush that holds 60 litres of ink. It is so heavy that she had to invent a special system to keep the brush suspended whilst allowing it freedom of movement.

Latterly, with Chinese painting techniques in mind, Verdier has reinterpreted the works of the great Flemish masters which enabled her to find a spectacular, innovative reading of their work for her latest exhibition in Belgium at the Groeninge Museum in Bruges, to which visitors flocked. Le French May Arts Festival is honoured to present work that is both steeped in Chinese culture and a forerunner in western contemporary art, to the Hong Kong public.

Studio Ghibli Layout Designs: Understanding the Secrets of Takahata and Miyazaki Animation exhibition Hong Kong Heritage Museum

Studio Ghibli was founded in 1985 by renowned animation directors Isao Takahata (高畑勳) and Hayao Miyazaki (宮崎駿). The Ghibli's animation films have been well received by worldwide audience, have won awards in various international film festivals and become a beloved part of popular culture.

As opposed to the widely used digital technology in arts nowadays, Takahata and Miyazaki insisted on producing their animation films basically by the traditional method of hand-drawn animation. This exhibition comprises over 1,300 items of layout designs selected from works by Isao Takahata and Hayao Miyazaki throughout their careers. The whole history of Studio Ghibli layout production is on display, ranging from Nausicaä of the Valley of the Wind to the latest released The Wind Rises and The Tale of The Princess Kaguya. Exhibits are drawn from the company's popular major works including Castle in the Sky, My Neighbor Totoro, Grave of the Fireflies, Kiki's Delivery Service, Princess Mononoke, Spirited Away, Ponyo on the Cliff by the Sea.

Michael Joo exhibition: 'Transparency Engine' Moot Gallery

Transparency Engine features glass sculptural works from recent and related bodies of work that have never been shown in Asia. The core of the installation, "Plexus" presents rows of glass riot shields lining the walls of SCAD Hong Kong's former municipal building. Side-by-side, with their handles removed, these shields create a reflective series of mirrors and appear as an endless unfolding screen.

The "Farmers & Merchants" (2012) sculptures incorporate the forms of ropes and stanchions used for crowd control. Their silvered Pyrex forms are at once fixed yet fluid, reflecting an unexpected juxtaposition of an object of art and the realm of social space. Entirely mirrored using silver nitrate, the works also refer to processes in early photographic production and further suggest a merging of image and self, sculpture and photography. Michael Joo says, "I would like the installation to suggest that we look deeper into the distorted looking glass of the works' surface to see there is no 'other' without an 'us.""







The museum is the home of Hong Kong's maritime heritage past, present and future where Hong Kong's maritime story is placed into its local, regional and international context. Its vision is to become the maritime museum showcasing Hong Kong and China's maritime connections to the world focused on the Pearl River Delta and the emergence and development of Hong Kong as a port and international shipping centre. It houses more than 5,000 artefacts, comprises 15 galleries including a special exhibition & events space, a resource centre, a roof-top café, a gift shop and nautical antique gallery.

Hong Kong Museum of Art

The Hong Kong Museum of Art is one of the museums managed by the Leisure & Cultural Services Department. Established in 1962, it was first housed in the City Hall, moving to its present purpose-built premises by the Hong Kong Cultural Centre in 1991. The museum also has a branch, the Flagstaff House Museum of Tea Ware, located in Hong Kong Park.

It is the mission of the Hong Kong Museum of Art to preserve the cultural heritage of China and promote art with a local focus. Its collections now number in excess of 16,000 art objects, including Chinese paintings and calligraphy works, antique Chinese treasures, paintings of historical significance as well as creations by local artists. The highlights of the collections are on display in the exhibition galleries. To maintain an essential international character, the museum also presents a great variety of thematic exhibitions drawn from local and overseas sources.

Promoting art among the general public is one of the museum's main objectives, and a wide range of educational programmes are organized in support of the exhibitions to enhance participants' knowledge of and interest in artistic creation.
