





OPENING TALK

Discoveries from the Sinan Shipwreck: the Art Market in Hangzhou and the Antiques from the Song and Yuan Dynasties

In the summer of 1323, a Chinese cargo ship set sail from the port of present-day Ningbo. On its journey to Hakata, the ship encountered a storm off the west cost of Korea. First discovered fortuitously by a fisherman, the Sinan shipwreck is Korea's largest underwater excavation and uncovered nearly 24,000 artifacts of everyday goods and luxury items bound for the Japanese market. Dr. Youngmi Kim, curator of the Asia Department at the National Museum of Korea will discuss discoveries from a shipwreck whose precious cargo offers a look into maritime trade and cultural exchanges in East Asia, and the social function of art among Yuan nobility.

The evening lecture and opening cocktail is the first of the Museum Lecture Series, co-presented by Asia Week Hong Kong and the Korean Culture Centre of the Korean Consulate, supported by the Korean Women's Association of Hong Kong.

Highlights of the Bonhams sale include:

Fine Chinese Ceramics and Works of Art

A very rare imperial amber-inlaid gilt-bronze 'dragon and twelve chilong' box and cover, 18th century

Exceptionally rare, the box and cover are an outstanding example of boxes made in the Imperial Palace Workshop, the Zaobanchu, under the supervision of the Neiwufu Imperial Household Department, which was in charge of the management of provisions for the Court, which included making of items for the personal use of the emperor and his family. The present box is a testament to the superb craftsmanship and technical perfection achieved during the 18th century.

Rare Jewels and Jadeite

A Rare Sapphire and Diamond Ring, circa 1980

The cushion-shaped sapphire, weighing 12.92 carats, within a marquise, baguette and brilliant-cut diamond surround (with diamonds approximately 3.50 carats in total) was recently discovered in a family's bank vault. Sapphires were first discovered in Kashmir around 1880 but most Kashmir mines rapidly depleted soon after. Termed as 'blue velvet' due to the superiority of their superb cornflower blue hue, most Kashmir sapphires that appear on the market today were discovered more than 100 years ago.

Bonhams Masterclass on Coloured Diamonds

The geological rarity of natural fancy coloured diamonds is owed to a number of factors. Guests have an opportunity to handle, preview, and discuss a selection of highlights from the forthcoming Rare Jewels and Jadeite auction with Graeme Thompson, Director of Jewellery, and Paul Redmayne, Head of Sale, Jewellery.

Of all the coloured diamonds, red is the rarest of all. Like pink diamonds, they are created through a process known scientifically as "Plastic Deformation". Such is their rarity that GIA (Gemological Institute of America) records show that from 1957 to 1987, not one laboratory report was issued for a diamond with "red" as the only descriptive term. Today, only a handful of red diamonds are recovered every few years, with the majority weighing considerably less than 1 carat. One of this sale's highlights is a rare fancy coloured diamond and diamond ring, the cushion-shaped fancy brownish red diamond, weighing 1.30 carats, between similarly cut diamond shoulders, ring size 5½.




GRADUATION EXHIBITION & AWARDS CEREMONY The Art of CUHK 2018

TWO-DAY FORUM

The Silk Road and the Art of the Tibetan Plateau Forum – Pāla Art and its Influence in China 青藏高原絲路與藝術論壇 — 波羅藝術與中國

The Tibetan Plateau, an important and active area on the ancient Silk Road, has left a rich and varied cultural and artistic heritage in its more than two thousand years of history, and has been the subject of much global academic research. Taking art history, cultural relics and archaeological discoveries in the countries and regions of the Tibetan Plateau as its theme, and against a broader historical/cultural background and time span, the Silk Road and the Art of the Tibetan Plateau Forum will focus on the study of Buddhist relics, artistic styles and archaeological discoveries in the core areas of the Silk Road such as the five Central Asian countries, Afghanistan, Pakistan, India, China and Nepal.

The aim is to understand from the perspective of art history and archaeology, how the Silk Road, as an economic and cultural epicenter, affected the many Himalayan areas it encompassed in terms of multicultural and religious dissemination, migration of ethnic groups, commerce, and trade.

ART TALK

Chinese Furniture in Siheyuan: their placement, function and inherent social implications

Classical Chinese furniture has been collected avidly for several decades. It is shown as an object of art in museums throughout the world. However, seldom is it placed in a period house to show its usage, except as an installation in museum exhibitions.

Oftentimes such installations are limited to a scholar's study, a bedroom and/ or a hall. The need for a comprehensive study on the interiors of a Chinese home has led to the publication of "Furnishing a Gracious Chinese Home" to explain the placement of furniture.

In the present talk, Philip Mak will guide the audience through the interior of various rooms with three-dimensional illustrations and explain its inherent social implications, in the siheyuan (四合院) during the Ming and Qing periods (14th-early 20th century).

MUSEUM LECTURE SERIES

Persianism and Domes of Medieval East Asia

Less celebrated today than their counterparts in the Roman and Byzantine West may well be the domes of ancient Iran. Featuring a distinctive structural device known as squinches, however, no less monumental domes did flourish in the Iranian world too, especially between the Parthian and Sasanian period. In fact, the domes that became so commonly adopted to the mosques around the world later on were derived of these earlier precedents. Besides, it is obvious that even before the advent of Islam, the ideas and forms of domes had reached Central and East Asia out of their Iranian heartland. The talk discusses such possible instances of domes in East Asia, and as a major case in point introduces the eight-century Silla Korean Buddhist sanctuary known as Sökkuram in Kyŏngju in connection to the Iranian and Central Asian prototypes.

Dr. Minku Kim is an assistant professor of art history at The Chinese University of Hong Kong, specializing China between the Han and Tang period (206 BCE-907 CE), particularly in relation to Buddhism.

Korean Traditional Dance : 舞(무) : 뭇다 ("mu(dance): mutda")

This performance showcases the beauty of Korean traditional dance. 舞(P) (pronounced as "mu") means "dance". "뭇다" (as "mutda") is a Korean word that has a meaning of "making a harmonized combination by putting together smaller objects".

"舞(早): 뭇다 (mu: mutda)" is the first of the series on "Transmission and Creation", introducing six stages of traditional dances. Each has its own distinctive colour, feature and characteristic, but all combined serve the fundamentals of Korean traditional dance throughout the history.



ARTISTS' GUIDED TOUR

Contemporary Blue-and-White: İznik Ceramics by Mehmet Gürsoy and Nida Olçar

This exhibition features forty ceramic works by two award-winning contemporary Turkish potters. Both artists work in a traditional İznik style that makes use of contemporary design elements. Mehmet Gürsoy was recognised as a UNESCO Living Human Treasure in 2009, while Nida Olçar, a much younger artist who has continued the renowned workshop and ceramic style of her late father Sitkı Olçar, was awarded the same prestigious UNESCO award in 2008.

İznik pottery is named after the town of İznik, where these finely decorated ceramics have been manufactured since the last quarter of the 15th century. Local craftsmen developed simple earthenware pottery into a more sophisticated manufacture of high-quality ceramics painted with cobalt blue patterns and coated with a colourless glaze.

This modern form of production developed under the patronage of the Ottoman court in Istanbul, which traded with China and greatly valued Chinese blue-and-white porcelain. Today, contemporary artists remain true to traditional design sources by creating objects that relate to cultural exchanges from the time of the Ming dynasty.

Visitors are welcomed to join the morning coffee session and guided tour with the artists on the first day of the exhibition.

CHARITY HERITAGE WALK Guided tour of Antiques Galleries in Central

Built at the founding of the colony in the mid-1800s, the second oldest street in Hong Kong takes its name from the woodland which once covered the area. On Hollywood Road, foreign traders and merchants sold artefacts from mainland China before making their way towards Europe. At its height in the 1980s, the stretch of Hollywood Road was home to over 100 antique shops.

The charity walk to Central's antiques galleries will include a visit to Teresa Coleman Fine Arts Ltd, established in Hong Kong in 1982. The gallery specialises in antique Chinese embroidered costumes and textiles, including wall hangings, embroidered curtains, collars, shoes, exquisitely carved and painted fans, and much more. The walk continues at Bonnie Lai Antiques, showcasing Tang Dynasty statues, as well as other high quality antiques from different dynasties. Every item has a certificate of authenticity. The visit concludes at KY Fine Arts, which has been dealing with Chinese ceramic antiques for several decades. They also have associations with many Chinese artists and calligraphers in China, Hong Kong and overseas.

COLLECTORS CIRCLE PANEL DISCUSSION

How valuable are art galleries, dealers and auction houses in building an important private collection?

Porcelain and Painting

Friendship is the close relation between two persons as determined by time and place. The close friendship of Chao Shao-an and Yang Shanshen, two masters of the Lingnan School of painting, brought about not only the meeting of minds but also led to the creation of interesting works of art.

Both Chao and Yang settled in Hong Kong in the 1940s, and they often met together in the Lingnan Art Studio, and they have spent their leisure and created joint paintings. When they made friends with the owner of the Yuet Tung China Works, Tso Wing-shui, they tried their hands at painting on porcelain using their own artistic style. This exhibition features their joint works on paper and on porcelain, selected from private collections which remain lesser known. Visitors will see how the two masters carried out their artistic dialogue in these works, and how they brought their own signature style from works on paper into works on porcelain.

Curated by Dr. Yuka Kadoi, The Blue Road: Mastercrafts from Persia is not only the first, but also the most dedicated and comprehensive exhibition surveying different aspects of the colour blue in Persian art and history in Hong Kong. Collaborating with eleven major institutions worldwide including the Victoria & Albert Museum in the United Kingdom; the David Collection in Denmark; the Asian Civilisations Museum in Singapore; and the Freer and Sackler Gallery Archives in the United States of America, the exhibition draws from an unparalleled scale of collaboration between a Hong Kong private museum and public international institutions with a united purpose in showcasing Persian decorative art to Asian audiences. The colour personifies a timeless quality in Persian history and the impact made on the shaping of other artistic traditions in Asia and beyond.

Age of Luxury, the Assyrians to Alexander

When one thinks about the ancient Mediterranean and Middle East, one tends to visualise the monumental architectural remains of palaces, gardens and city walls. These places were once alive with the wealthy ruling classes and filled with precious and luxurious objects, such as metalwork, stone wall-reliefs, ivories, gems and jewellery. The period from 900 to 300 BC was an age when such luxurious goods were made and traded from India to the Mediterranean. Mighty empires, the Assyrians, Babylonians and Achaemenids, created elites that demanded exotic, luxurious and opulent objects to display their social status. As a result, cheaper imitations of luxury goods were also created. Ultimately the wealth of the Achaemenid empire proved to be an irresistible prize for Alexander the Great. His spectacular military success meant he eventually ruled territories from Greece to India and as a result Greek art and culture spread throughout the Middle East.

This newly developed exhibition contains objects from the British Museum, and Hong Kong is the first stop where all 210 exhibits will be displayed together. They will allow visitors to learn more about the "Age of Luxury" from 900-300 BC.

Jane Lee: Red States

As the title Red States suggests, the color red dominates this new body of work–not as a single color, but in a spectrum of shades that mirrors the range of its associations–from passion and action to blood and life to cultural and political references to luck, auspiciousness and the representation of people and the nation.

Jane Lee first came to critical attention in 2008 when her massive installation Raw Canvas was featured in the Singapore Biennale curated by Fumio Nanjo. Paint, canvas, frame, orientation and dimension—all are variables in Jane Lee's hands. Through assiduous processes of layering, mixing, winding, wrapping, kneading, daubing and other acts of physical transformation, the artist redefines paint and painting to produce dynamic and bold forms.

Red States comprises a diverse yet cohesive mix of new sculptural paintings and site-specific installations produced for this presentation. The exhibition spans all levels of the Hong Kong Arts Centre's Pao Galleries, with paintings, sculptures and a large-scale installation suspended from the ceiling on the top floor, accompanied by studies and reference materials tracing the evolution of Lee's practice on the lower level. The retrospective portion of the exhibition is curated by Michelle Ho, assistant director of Singapore's ADM Gallery at the School of Art, Design and Media, Nanyang Technological University, and former curator at the Singapore Art Museum.

Sincere Brush: Works of Ting Yin-yung Courtesy of His Students and Friends in the Department of Fine Arts, CUHK

Ting Yin-yung (1902–1978) was a native of present-day Gaozhou, Guangdong province. Returning to China after studies in western painting in Tokyo in 1920–1925, Ting worked in the field of art in Shanghai, Guangzhou and Chongqing before settling in Hong Kong in 1949. During those times of hardship, he embarked on a long artistic journey to straddle the realms of both Chinese and Western art. Starting his career with oil painting, he was hailed as the "Eastern Matisse" after the French Fauvist painter whose work he appreciated especially. He later turned to traditional Chinese ink painting, as well as calligraphy and seal carving, heavily influenced by Bada Shanren (1626–1705) which earned him a reputation as the "Modern Bada Shanren".

Ting's art is particularly noted for transcending the East-West divide, with delightful innovations on time-worn subjects. His expressive ink painting, executed with simple, child-like brushstrokes, marks him as a major pioneer in twentieth-century Chinese painting by common assent.

On the occasion of the fortieth anniversary of Ting's passing, his former students and friends at the Department of Fine Arts, CUHK, are organizing the present exhibition in his memory and donating their cherished works of his over the past few decades to the permanent collection of the Art Museum, CUHK.

Bosshard in China: Documenting Social Change in the 1930s

The exhibition presents a comprehensive sweep of black and white photographs and documentary films produced by Swiss photo-journalist Walter Bosshard. Living and traveling extensively in China from 1933 to 1939, Bosshard was one of the earliest journalists to record this critical decade in Chinese and world history. Bosshard's work is of historical significance as most Western photographers only went to China for individual assignments, but did not live there for extended periods. Many of the Chinese photographers were politically engaged or had been commissioned, which resulted in a more selective subject matter and consistent narrative. Remarkably, Bosshard's documentary photography and film are neither colonialist nor otherwise politically motivated.

Apart from documenting daily life in urban centres and rural regions, Bosshard also photographed and interviewed key political figures, including Mao Zedong in Yan'an, Chiang Kaishek and Soong Mei-ling, Madame Chiang Kaishek. In wartime activities, Bosshard strived to remain a neutral observer, letting his images capture the scenes unfolding around him.

Bosshard's work in the 1930s was one of the primary means by which the Far East came to life across living rooms in Europe and America, affording a more holistic view of a country that was perceived internationally as highly important but altogether remained little known.

Asia Society Hong Kong Center

Asia Society Hong Kong Center (ASHK) is located at the former Explosives Magazine of the old Victoria Barracks, a site steeped in history, cultural significance, and natural beauty in the heart of Hong Kong's business district of Admiralty.

The 1.364-hectare site, which houses a group of four former military buildings, was built by the British Army in the mid-19th century for the production and storage of explosives and ammunition. It was subsequently expanded and taken over by the Royal Navy in the early 20th century, and left abandoned in the 1990s until its revitalisation by ASHK in 2005.

Through the vision of internationally acclaimed architects Tod Williams and Billie Tsien, as well as meticulous conservation, restoration, and adaptive reuse, this heritage site was transformed into a cultural, artistic and intellectual hub in Hong Kong in 2012. ASHK offers a great variety of programmes in the form of lectures, performances, film screenings, exhibitions and heritage tours to the community.

Béthanie Museum

The restoration of Béthanie, built by the Mission Étrangères de Paris in 1875, was completed in November 2006 and it is reborn as the new home of School of Film and Television, Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts.

The basement wine cellar was converted into a museum recording the history of Béthanie and of the French Mission's activities throughout Asia during the past three centuries, under the patronage of BNP Paribas. Béthanie and the adjacent historic Dairy Farm cowsheds, now known as the Wellcome Theatre, house two performance venues, an exhibition hall, a chapel and the museum.

The Béthanie was completed in 1875 by the Society of Foreign Mission (Société des Missions Étrangères) as their first sanatorium in the East Asia for sick missionaries. In 2002, the Government decided to restore and lease the Béthanie together with the adjacent Old Dairy Farm Cowshed Building (Grade 2 historic building) to the Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts for conversion into the Academy's second campus. The conversion was completed in 2006.

In 2013, the Government announced that the Antiquities Authority declared the Béthanie as a historical monument. The Béthanie was also awarded an Honorable Mention at the 2008 UNESCO Asia-Pacific Cultural Heritage Awards.

Chinese Cultural Studies Center

Chinese Cultural Studies Center (CCSC) is a non-profit organisation that seeks to promote, foster, and restore traditional Chinese art and culture through recognition of and collaboration with individuals, groups, organisations and communities who are similarly committed to cultural expression, conservation, and development.

The CCSC library houses a private collection of books and rare Chinese manuscripts, which aims to provide resources and services supporting research, learning needs, and dissemination of knowledge in Chinese culture. The rare manuscripts that the library holds includes shanben printed in the Ming and Qing Dynasty that have been listed in the First and Second batch of "Guo Jia Zhen Gui Gu Ji Ming Lu," an official directory from the Chinese government on old manuscripts that have been designated as having significant cultural value.

CCSC regularly hosts events and lectures open to the public and its members, on a wide range of topics pertaining to Chinese culture, as well as engaging in long-term cultural projects for research purposes.

Comix Home Base

Comix Home Base (CHB), located between Mallory Street & Burrows Street in Wan Chai, was established in 2013. The Hong Kong Arts Centre is the operator of this Urban Renewal Authority preservation and revitalisation project. It is also the first Hong Kong art community combining comics, animation, and historic architecture.

Comprising a cluster of ten pre-war Grade Two historic buildings built in the 1910s, these historically significant buildings were homes of the working class. Prominent features of the project such as cantilevered balconies, tiled pitched roof, timber French doors and internal timber staircase are retained and preserved. The revitalised building cluster also includes a Public Open Space for comics and animation artists as well as a Comix Salon that collects print and digital comic publications. CHB is dedicated to sharing the latest and the best comics, animations and creative works of related media with the public, bringing art into the community.

Built in the 1840s, Flagstaff House originally served as the office and residence of the Commander of the British Forces in Hong Kong. It was converted to the Museum of Tea Ware in 1984, with a new wing, the K.S. Lo Gallery, added in 1995. Alongside its exhibitions, the Museum holds regular tea demonstrations, tea gatherings and lecture programmes to promote ceramic art and Chinese tea drinking culture.

The Hong Kong Maritime Museum (HKMM), an independent, non-profit registered charity supported by the shipping industry, the business community, private individuals and the Hong Kong SAR Government, is a vibrant cultural institution dedicated to preserving, collecting and displaying objects that tell the story about trade and maritime in Hong Kong and the Pearl River Delta, and the vital roles that ships and the sea play in our past, present and future.

The Museum opened its door to the public at Murray House in Stanley in 2005 and then relocated to the Central Pier No. 8 in the heart of the Central Harbour Waterfront since 2013. Today the Museum displays nearly 1,000 objects in 15 galleries and attracts more than 100,000 visitors annually. The University Museum and Art Gallery (UMAG) of the University of Hong Kong was founded in 1953 as the Fung Ping Shan Museum. It is the oldest continuously-operated museum in Hong Kong and has over the past sixty years built up a diverse collection of ceramics and bronzes dating from the Neolithic period (c. 7000-c. 2100 BC) to the Qing dynasty (1644-1911), as well as traditional and modern paintings from the Ming dynasty (1368-1644) to the 21st century.

Chief amongst the collections are the Museum's ceramics, which show the extraordinary achievements of Chinese potters from Neolithic period painted pottery jars, to the decorative porcelains of the Qing dynasty.

Video Bureau

Once a film no longer plays in theatres, one can still watch it online; but once an exhibition ends, it would be difficult to watch video artwork - primarily because its audience is not the general public and its copyright needs to be protected.

The impetus of establishing Video Bureau grew out of this simple demand. In 2012, Chen Tong, Zhu Jia and Fang Lu collectively founded the Video Bureau in Beijing, and in the same year, opened a second venue in Guangzhou. The two spaces, while focusing on different tasks but sharing the same functions, are both service-oriented non-profit private organisations.

Video Bureau's work primarily consists of archiving video artworks and its related documents in order to build a comprehensive and searchable database for researchers, students and collectors. As an organisation open to the public, every two months, artworks and archival materials of two new artists are made available. Up to May 2018, at the rate of establishing 12 artists' profiles annually, Video Bureau houses 75 artist profiles with a total of more than 1500 works of video art, related archival materials.
